### CACT Annual Meeting & Awards Luncheon

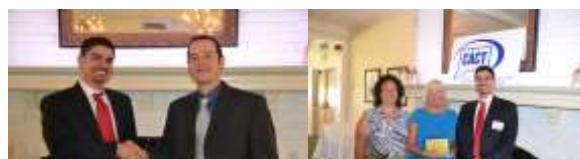

Dunham has been in the public transportation sector for many years. She was with the Greater Hartford Transit District for the past 20 years as their Chief Financial Officer and also served as the Coordinator of the Connecticut Drug and Alcohol Testing Consortium.

## Transportation Bonding

On Friday, July 25, the state Bond Commission borrowed a total of \$725 million Friday. Funding for transportation projects made up \$475 million as the largest item on a lengthy agenda. "There is a lot of transportation dollars in this budget," Gov. Dannel P. Malloy said after the meeting. "In fact, if you broke down the budget it's largely transportation and housing, are the two largest expenditure items, two things that I am very much personally invested in."

## Highway Trust Fund

Senators Bob Corker and Chris Murphy have proposed a 6 cent per gallon increase in federal fuel taxes in each of the next two years, indexing the tax to inflation.
