Connecticut Transportation Updates

Bond Commission

The Bond Commission met on September 29 and approved Department of Transportation Special Tax Obligation Bonds to repair state bridges, state roads and LOCIP in the amount of \$170, 444,006, and \$17,550,000 to finance Let's Go! CT initiatives and projects.

Transit Public Hearing

The Connecticut Public Transportation Commission (CPTC) is holding a series of public hearings around the state for transit supporters and advocates to voice their opinions on transit needs and services in the state. Following the public hearings, the CPTC will outline their recommendations (as they do every year) to the General Assembly's Transportation Committee, the Governor and the DOT Commissioner. The next hearing will be held at 7:00 pm on Oct. 13 at Stamford Town Hall.
