Bus Fare Increase Proposed

DOT has proposed a rate increase, raising fares from \$1.30 to \$1.50 for a one-way ride; ADA and paratransit would go from .65 cents to .75 cents; ADA would rise to \$3.00 from \$2.60; and monthly commuter fares on express routes from between \$12 and \$24. 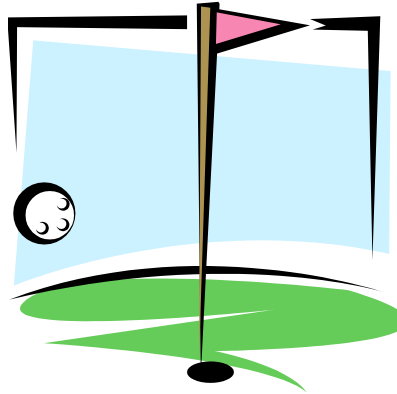
